How to get here:

When booking flights please note that there are three airports that can be used: Oslo Airport Gardermoen, Oslo Torp, Moss Airport Rygge.

- Oslo Airport (Gardermoen) is main airport for Oslo, and the one closest to the city centre. The airport is approx. 25 min from the city centre by airport train, and it costs about 160-170 NOK for a one-way ticket.
- Moss Airport Rygge: This airport is about 1 hour by airport bus, and costs ca. 120 NOK for a one-way ticket.
- Oslo Torp: This airport is about 2 hours by airport bus, and costs ca. 160 NOK for a one-way ticket.
